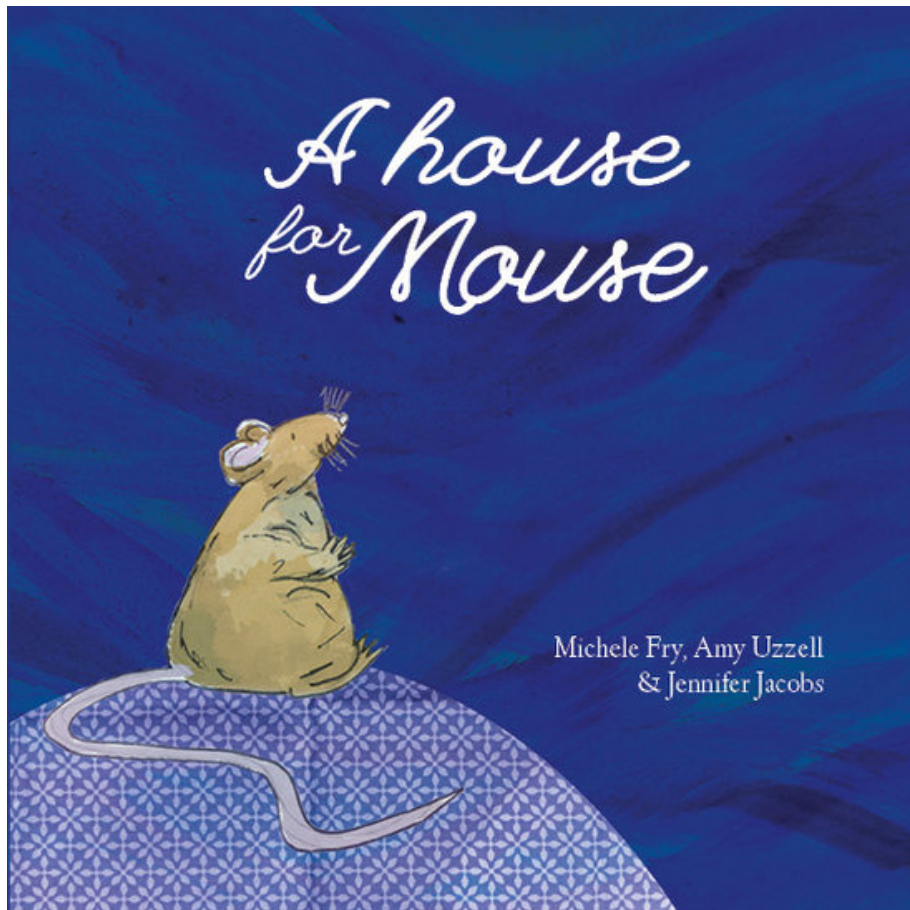

“Thank you,” said Mouse.





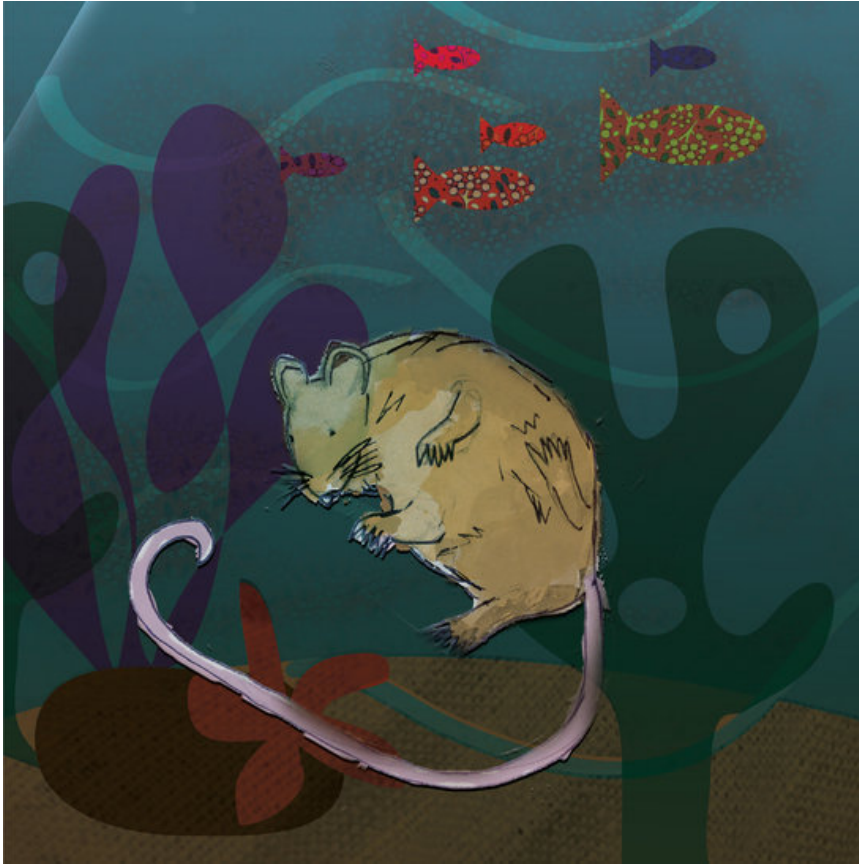
That night, Mouse's dreams were noisy and wild.

said Fish.

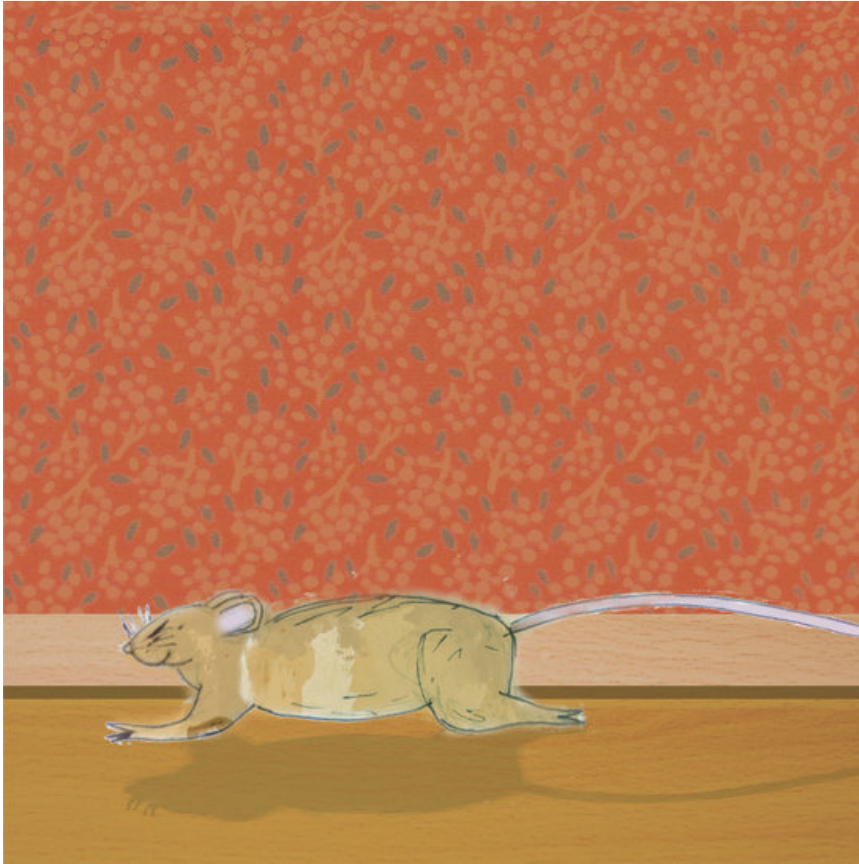
“Thank you,” said Mouse.

Mouse needed somewhere warm and dry.

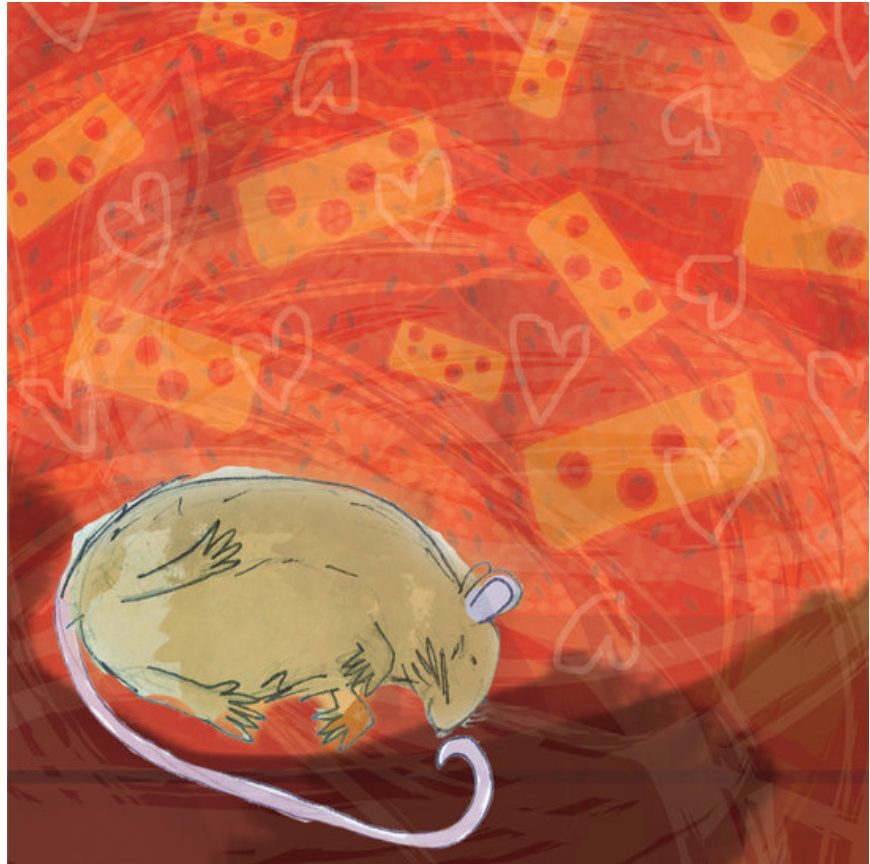




Mouse found a bookshelf nearby.

Good night Mouse.

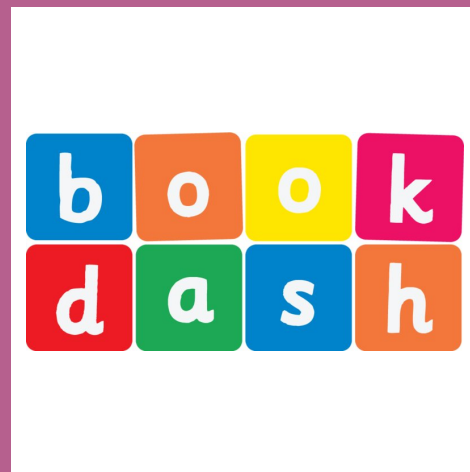
