




Introducing iLearnabout digital conservation education resources

iLearnabout plans to build a range of digital resources to support after-school clubs and conservation initiatives. Teachers and learners will be supported by the on-line, iLearnabout conservation club. The resources will be structured into a topic framework which is being developed in consultation with clubs and organisations. This framework is under review.

iLearnabout Topics




Each topic will consist of a variety of resources, all available in digital format. We are calling these **digital topic packs**. Organisations can choose the topic pack(s) they want and download them free to use offline. There is no need to use topics in a particular order or to use all of the topics.

Digital topic packs will contain:

- Video 'scene-setter: introducing the topic
- Learning modules: up to three interactive digital lessons which include audio, illustrations, animations, quizzes and short activities
- Fact-files: supporting further research
- Challenges: guides to carrying out longer projects relevant to the topic. This is a chance for children to choose from a range of projects and put what they have learnt into action locally.
